February is here. Only a few more weeks of Winter, ok maybe a bit more than a few but let's stay positive.

COMMUNICATION UPCOMING EVENTS /FACILITY USAGE

As we try to improve communication and give members more notice of upcoming events we have started a policy in which any event to be held at the clubhouse or beach requires that a form be completed with the who, what, when, and where. The form is to be completed in time for it to be in the news and views as well as mass mailings.

UPCOMING MAILINGS

As I said in December, you will all be getting two mailings. We had hoped to have them out sooner but there were some issues between the two councils so one of the mailings will be delayed. One of the mailings is for Basic Membership. The other is the update for the ongoing legal matter.

WEB SITE IMPROVEMENTS

Sebastian is continuing to make improvements to the membership data base and website. Check the website for upcoming events. Many of them you will be able to register for.

We strongly encourage everyone to renew online and be sure to check that your entire family is added to your profile. Signing up on line only takes a few minutes and will save you lots of time at the clubhouse when you come to pick up your 2019 supplies.

DREWES BEACH

You may have noticed several large white boards on Drewes beach. They are covering large wash out holes in the beach. We met with AAA dock regarding the wall and we discussed 3 options;

- 1: Just repair the blow out area
- 2: Repair the blow out and other damaged panels
- 3: Using our materials put a run in ramp

Our meeting took place in the rain where we were able to see water incursion over and through the parking lot entering the beach. We discussed several options here as well. The most effective and easiest would be to increase the height of the base that the fence is in and build a berm where the double gate is. We also need to clean out all the debris behind the curb stops so that water may flow towards the storm drain faster. There are other items as well but may involve the town.

EASEMENT ASSESMENT LAWSUIT UPDATE

On October 29th the two parties appeared before the Court to discuss changes requested by the plaintiff.

The Judge has ruled to move forward on the class action suit which will join all 2200 property owners in the original purchase tract of Lake Parsippany that received an invoice in 2017. The plaintiff will act as class representative for all of the 2200 effected properties and the plaintiffs' attorney was appointed class counsel.

In the coming weeks all property owners in the original purchase tract will be receiving mail prepared by both parties in one package. The mailing list to be used will be the same list from January of 2017. The mailing will contain a brief letter of explanation prepared by both parties, a copy of the Judge's October 29, 2018 Order, and a copy of the amended complaint.

The cost for the mailing will be split evenly between the plaintiff and the LPPOA. At this time there is no timeline for next steps once mailing has been sent/received.

BASIN TREES

I have had several emails and calls with town regarding the pine trees that are dead or have fallen in the basins. I am hopeful this work will commence soon.

CLUBHOUSE

At the December board meeting we discussed replacing the clubhouse tables. The tables were very unstable. Thanks to the efforts of Ed and Sebastian they were able to locate specific parts including replacement leg assemblies to repair the existing tables. These efforts saved us considerable money.

Ed and I took a board count of the decking material. I will get pricing, but we will not proceed until weather warms up. Once we have a few dates we will send out an email for some help to get the deck surface replaced quickly.

BEACH MANAGER

We finalized the job description for the beach manger position. This is a great summer job for a teacher or para professional. More information can be found on our web site.




SANTA BREAKFAST


It would be appreciated if you could bring a snack, appetizer or dessert.




