PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I first want to thank all our members for their continued support of the place we call home. There is something special about Lake Parsippany, no matter if you have lived here all your life or have only been here a short time you can share so many memories and stories.

This year we have had many unexpected and/or unbudgeted items:

- An emergency repair at the clubhouse to bring the fire suppression system into compliance, the cost was nearly \$3000.00
- An emergency repair at Drewes Beach. You may have walked by and saw work being done along the wall. There were several large holes in the wall caused by winter ice that caused wash out on the beach. The cost for the repair is \$3000.00. The repair is temporary because the extensive repair required will cost more than \$25,000.00, money we simply don't have.
- We needed to increase our budget to cover mandatory wage increases and

additional insurance requirements. These totaled approximately \$6000.00.

The total so far this year for these unbudgeted items comes to \$12,000.00. Hopefully there will be no more surprises.

We are working to end our relationship with Cedar Crest Property Management to help offset the budget shortfall.

We are doing all that we can to sustain the lake, the clubhouse and the property, but it is getting more and more difficult. As we said back in 2016 we projected a 5 to 7-year duration until we simply could not continue to operate. We are now into year 3.

I do have some good news. We will be spreading two loads of new sand on Hoffman beach and as part of the repair at Drewes two loads there too. I was contacted by a member painter who has volunteered to paint Hoffman Beach. We had hoped to get it done before the summer but the weather did not cooperate.

As you know, a group of residents (Plaintiffs) filed a lawsuit against LPPOA, objecting to mandatory fees and assessments. This group then asked the court if they could include all property owners, so everyone is now joined in the lawsuit.

LPPOA is represented by a lawyer, as are the Plaintiffs, and you recently received a copy of the lawsuit, with a cover letter and Court Order. (Both parties were ordered to share the costs of the mailing, but LPPOA is still waiting for reimbursement from the Plaintiffs' group.)

Please consult the website (www.lake-parsippany.org) for more information. LPPOA's lawyer is through its insurance carrier, and so the cost is covered. However, Plaintiffs hired their own attorney, who is apparently being paid by those who filed the suit.

We understand there is an effort to encourage more residents to join their group, possibly so the costs can be shared by more residents. It is not necessary to join in on either side of this suit, but we urge you to contact your attorney if you have any questions regarding the Plaintiffs seeking attorney's fees from you.


Since we last report, LPMYC helped on clean-up-day at Johnson Beach. LPMYC removed all the litter along the dike between Johnson Beach and the spillway.
