### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Membership has been ongoing since January and the response for early payment has been very positive.

I want to thank the Men's club for doing a great job on the Super Bowl party. Events like this are a great way to bring folks out. We encourage people to step up and implement other similar events throughout the year.

#### **Board meeting procedural changes:**

In an effort to move the questions along we will be asking that all questions be submitted in writing. We will do our best to answer them during the meeting but some may require research, but we will get back to you. We may ask for your email address to do that.

We do value input. Good ideas need good people to get involved to work on a proposal.

We will also not be answering any questions about interpretation of the court decision.

To offer some background, the plaintiff filed a class action lawsuit in late 2018. The plaintiff named themselves representative for the class. That means the plaintiff represented ALL of us. Every property owner was informed of this action and they had the option to decline the action.

The court ruled in favor of the LPPOA. Since it was a class action suit the decision carries across all properties. All of the court documents can be found on our website. If you have questions about the decision you may want to speak with your own council.

### Clearing up Confusion, Crushing Rumors and Misinformation:

#### The LPPOA is going to take my home.

The payment and collection policy can be found on our website. Nowhere does it state or imply that the LPPOA can or will take your home.

#### Why did the township receive invoices?

This was simply as a matter of practice. The properties owned by the township could be sold and at that time the new owner would be required to pay the fees

going forward but not the back fees. Therefore, we have to keep the properties on the list.

## I received 2 invoices that appear to be duplicates.

First you should check the Lot and Block numbers listed under the address. If they are the same, then it was simply a printing error. If they are different then you are responsible to pay both.

#### Why are you hiding the budget?

The budget can be found in the November 2019 News & Views posted on our website. Yes, it is marked preliminary, but it was voted on in December 2019 with no changes. Following a recommendation received, we will be adding a financial tab to the website in the coming months and the budget and other related items may get added there.

#### **Invoice Confusion**

We understand there has been some confusion in reading/understanding the invoices. Hopefully this will help.

Line 1 will say 2017 Easement Assessment (This is the \$115 due for 2017)

Line 2 will say Credit 2017 Easement Assessment (Only if 2017 was paid)

Line 3 will indicate the fee for 2020 (with options noted below such as senior discount) the fee is \$315.00

If you only want to pay the \$115 for 2020 you may do so but you should read the entire invoice to understand the difference between full and basic membership offerings.

If you choose to only pay \$115 when your invoice states you owe for 2017 and 2020 you will only be credited for 2017. Therefore, you will still owe for 2020 and be subject to late fees.

If you are a senior over 65 you are eligible for a senior discount with a fee of \$285.00.

We strongly recommend that you sign up on line. We send most information via email saving about \$12-\$15,000 per year vs tradition mailing.

The annual trout stocking event will be here before we know it. It can't come soon enough for me. The trout stocking event will be April 4, 2020. The boathouse will be manned by 8am and the coffee, hot chocolate and donuts will be ready to fuel everyone for the event. Please plan on arriving by 9am or even a bit earlier. The stocking truck can show-up anytime between 9am and 10am. I have placed the order for the trout and this year we will be getting, 358 12" to 14" trout and five large trout ranging in size from 17" to 25". We have three prizes to associate to three of the large trout. If you would like to sponsor a trout by purchasing a large trout and or associating a prize to a trout, it would be greatly appreciated. I can still order additional large trout should anyone like to sponsor a trout of a certain size and I might be able to order a specific species of trout. The choices could be, rainbow trout, brown trout, tiger trout and maybe even a golden trout.

Reminder the lake is closed to fishing from 7am on April 4th until the opening day for New Jersey's 2020 trout season. Opening

day is April 11th and you can't fish until 8am. A current New Jersey fishing license is required to fish Lake Parsippany. If you plan on fishing for trout and or possessing trout, you must also purchase a trout stamp. A fishing license is required by New Jersey. This is not a LPPOA regulation, it is a New Jersey regulation. Anglers between the ages of 16 and 69 must have a license visibly displaced anywhere you fish in New Jersey.


Even though Lake Parsippany is private, we are still required to follow all New Jersey freshwater angling regulation. We can make the angling regulation at Lake Parsippany stronger than New Jersey regulation, but we can't weaken the regulations.

There are a lot of folks that consider the opening day of trout season to be the start of fishing season. There really isn't a "fishing season". Every day is fishing season. Fishing is never closed. There are closed period/s for fish species, creel limits and size limits. Fishing never stops and that is one reason fishing is a great sporting activity.

I'm looking forward to seeing everyone at the trout stocking event.

Remember it's not always about catching fish, it's about being outdoors and enjoying the adventure with your family and friends.

Hope your next cast is one you will never forget.



We all agreed that the author did a great job of slowly unravelling the story, giving us bits at a time. Through Rachel's mother's journal entries and flashbacks, the details of the tragedy unfold. Durrow's insights into interracial racism and living as a biracial child sparked some interesting conversation. 
Boats are being stored or worked on...

After the success of our annual Lake Parsippany Invitational last October, another regatta date has already made the national calendar for October 3 and 4, 2020.


Until then, spring will soon come with its clear waters, flapping birds and breezy afternoons alongside the nicely restored Johnson beach dike.
