is found in the By-Laws, located on the website. Officers must reside in Districts 1 thru 4. Vacancies may be filled by the Board of Trustees following the elections. District 5 Members are not eligible for nomination nor voting.

In accordance with the New Jersey Nonprofit statutes, all Board members have a fiduciary obligation to serve in good faith and in the best interest of the LPPOA. Additionally, DCA regulations require any person appointed to the board must be duly elected at the next annual election cycle. Due to resignations and other appointments, we have many positions to fill this year.

Nominations must be in writing, list the nominees and their addresses, be signed by a member in good standing making the nomination (if property is in the name of a corporation or other entity, the signatory must be accompanied by a corporate resolution designating the agent), and his or her address, mailed via certified mail to LPPOA, PO Box 62, Parsippany NJ 07054 and received by LPPOA by August 7, 2021. Nominations will be opened and announced at the August 9, 2021 Board meeting; membership good standing status of each nominee must be confirmed to be included in the ballot.

Watch for additional election details to be provided by US Mail and a variety of electronic means. Additional information about the Annual Meeting will also be provided in future communiques.

Reminder about "membership in good standing": Membership in good standing requires that the property has paid all outstanding membership dues and fees as determined by the Treasurer and in accordance with applicable laws, regulations and LPPOA policies.



# HISTORY OF LAKES APPRECIATION MONTH

July is Lakes Appreciation Month, a nationwide effort to acknowledge and appreciate the vital role water plays in our lives. It all started with a few individuals and a common goal.

The North American Lake Management Society (NALMS) was founded in Portland, Maine in 1980 as an organization with membership open to both professionals and citizens interested in applied lake management. One of the primary focuses of the organization in its early years was the funding of Section 314 of the Clean Water Act, the Clean Lakes Program. The Clean Lakes Program provided funds, through the states, to clean up individual lakes.

In July 1998, NALMS launched Lakes Appreciation Week to focus attention on lakes and reservoirs, their unique value as well as the management issues they face.

By 2003, Lakes Appreciation Week became Lakes Appreciation Month, held each July.

In July 2019, Governor Phil Murphy proclaimed July as Lakes Appreciation Month in New Jersey.

Clean and healthy lakes, rivers, and streams not only offer endless recreational opportunities, but provide us with drinking water, energy, and irrigation. They also serve as natural wildlife habitats for many plant and animal species.



#### Time capsule (Cont.)

We owe a lot to our freshwater communities, which are a significant life resource. However, that life resource is finite.

- 3% of our planet's water is fresh water. That includes lakes, rivers, glaciers and polarice caps.
- 2.5% of the earth's fresh water is unavailable: locked up in glaciers, polarice caps, atmosphere, and soil; highly polluted; or lies too far under the earth's surface to be extracted at an affordable cost.
- 0.5% of the earth's water is available fresh water.

Rehabilitating and protecting these environments is crucial to the quality of our communities and the benefit of future generations.

The Lake Parsippany Property Owners Association is a proud member of the New Jersey Coalition of Lake Associations. Together with lake community associations, individuals, municipality officials, professionals, and specialty organizations, we are dedicated to protecting and preserving our lakes and ponds.

First there wasn't and then there was. Before God, no one was.

So begins Anita Amirrezvanis' book The Blood of


The author took 9 years to weave this fictional story that is interspersed with historical facts from 1620's Persia. The time and research are well worth it, we were immersed in the details. This time period among other things, was known for fine art and architecture under the rule of Shah Abbas the Great.

Carpet weaving had an especially important role at this time. And our young unnamed narrator has a curiosity about the carpet making process, from the plants that the dyes come from, how to achieve certain hues, to color combinations, intricate designs and tightness of knots. If you have ever done latch-hook, you'll have a fractional idea of how to create a Persian carpet!

Per the Authors Note, the main character was deliberately left unnamed, "in tribute to the anonymous artisans of Iran".

The main character through a sad event and perhaps even because of a comet, (the people of the time believed comets brought calamities and chief astronomers predicted these events in almanacs) had to leave her village and travel

on camel to the capital city of Isfahan. Fun fact, camels were not allowed inside the city!

The bustling, brightly colored city of Isfahan opens up her world and nurtures her natural artistic gift for carpet design and making. Our hero goes through her journey of growth and

maturity in very difficult ways, interspersed with small pleasures, but details of the way of life at the time is finely chronicled in this tale. We had a lot to talk about and wonder how much has changed for the women in that part of the world. One thing is for certain, you will never look at a hand-made carpet the same way again.

'My back ached, my limbs were stiff, and I had not slept enough for a month. I thought about all the labor and suffering that were hidden beneath a carpet, starting with materials. Vast fields of flowers had to be murdered for their dye, innocent worms boiled alive for their silk—-and what about knotters?

Must we sacrifice ourselves for the sake of rugs? '...All our labors were in service of beauty, but sometimes it seemed as if every thread in a carpet had been dipped in the blood of flowers.'



### **BUILDER'S CORNER**

To improve our 3d printing setting and technique for model yachts, we decided a good start would be to design and print a "footy". A "footy" is a class of model yacht that has a only one class rule. The hull and keel must fit inside a box that is one foot long, one foot deep and ½ foot wide. Hence the name "footy".


To create the hull, we used our Delftship model of our one meter Liberty. We compressed it from one meter to one foot long. To get a reasonable displacement for this size model, we scaled the beam and depth of the hull for a displacement of 650 grams.

We exported that data and created a printable 3d model. It took 2 hours to print the hull. Other parts including internals took another 3 to 4 hours to complete.
