SEPTEMBER ELECTION TO BE DONE ELECTRONICALLY FOR 2ND YEAR

This year's election process will mimic last year's process. That is to say, we will be using Election Buddy for casting and tallying votes on Sunday morning, September 12, 2021, between 9am - 3pm EDT. The Election Committee Hopes to announce preliminary results by the end of the Annual Meeting of the Association which takes place at Noon the same day.

Every eligible property owner (all those whose membership is paid and is deemed by the Treasurer to be in good standing) on August 15th will be sent instructions via US Mail from Election Buddy and/or the LPPOA Election Committee. Properties becoming eligible for voting after Aug 15th will receive separate instructions and will be allowed to vote.

Provisions will be made for those property owners who become eligible at the last minute or who do not have access to a computer or smart phone. The Election Committee will ensure that all property owners in good standing as of 12pm EDT, September 11th will be able to vote. Full details will be provided via US Mail in the very near future. Please watch for the mailings.

Additional information and "Meet and Greet" events with the candidates will be announced in the near future via the LPPOA website and official email alerts. Plans are still being finalized as of this writing. Please watch for details.

HEALING ARTS CIRCLE

The first Healing Arts Circle of Lake Parsippany was held July 22nd at the Clubhouse.

Facilitator Dr. Randolph Shipon said 11 adults turned out for the event featuring original improvisational music, crafts, and discussion of processing emotions through art.

"People are interested in finding community to scaffold with their interests," Shipon, a local psychologist and musician behind Shockocracy, said.

"We are creating an opportunity to heal through arts and share that healing process. Opportunities will present themselves for artists to discover and connect their talents."

Shipon explained the rationale for the gathering. "The synthesis of emotional processing is often artistic," he said. "Group members expressed interest in dance, music, energy work, yoga, martial arts and culinary arts as topics we will explore and celebrate as a community."

Shipon is leading the effort to create Lake Parsippany as a known place of healing. Shipon is a core member of a workgroup called You Are Your Own Hero, a self-sovereignty project led by Dr Tassel F. Shanebrook.

"Stepping out in the water is an act of faith," Shipon said, noting that the waters of Lake Parsippany have helped his own physical and emotional healing. "Stepping into interests is like that too. Our interests connect us and we can only heal in the sharing of these artistic and healing outlets."

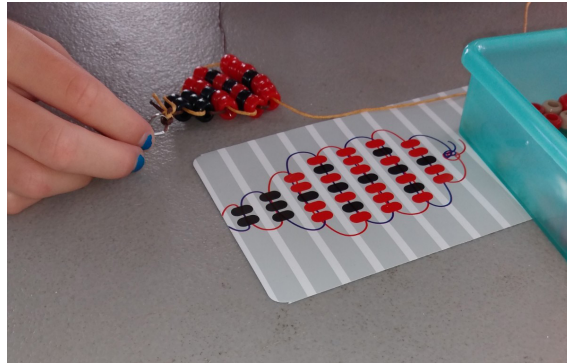
Members of the initial group were treated to pizza and some Shockocracy swag like challenge coins and lapis lazuli bracelets.

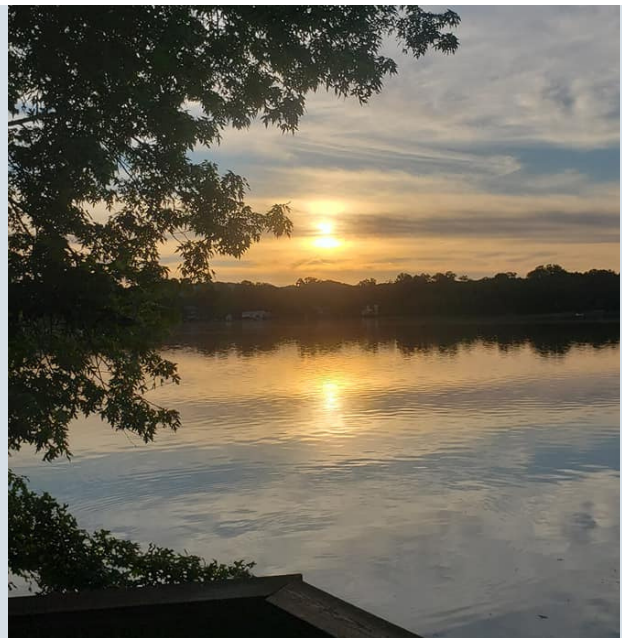

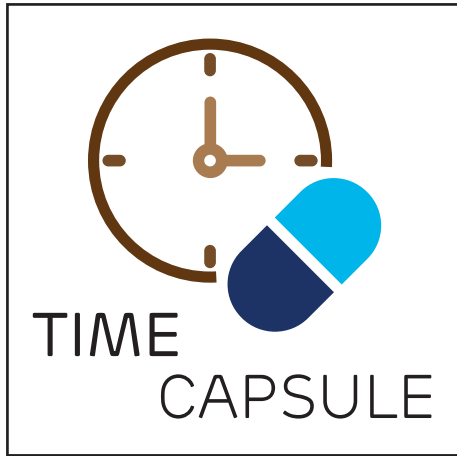

HISTORY THRU OUR MONTHLY NEWSLETTER

The history of our association has been told thru our monthly newsletter since the start of our community. The first published newsletter, titled "Lake Parsippany Pilot" was printed by the Daily Mirror in the spring of 1934. As developers of the community, The Mirror Holding Company used the first publishing as a template for what has become The News & Views. They encouraged the community to get involved and take interest for their benefit.

1934



"This, the first issue of the Lake Parsippany Pilot, has been undertaken by the undersigned in the belief that a medium where lot owners can

exchange ideas regarding their common weal would be a distinct advantage to all concerned,

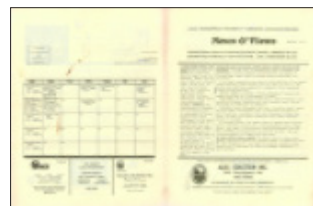
and with the hope that in time it will be taken over by your organization and become a permanent part of its activities so that you may all be familiar with your problems and your progress. The purpose is to bring the members of the Lake Parsippany family into closer contact with each other, so that there will be a real community of interest as well as ownership. To get the greatest benefit out of your holdings, it will be your mutual advantage to take an active interest in the affairs of the community, make any suggestions you may have for the betterment of same, and help carry out the plans as formulated. Any ideas you may have will be welcome and as many as space permits will be published in future issues." – Lake Parsippany Pilot 1934.

In the 1960's



The News & Views was published as a one-page newsletter, available to all members. The header displayed the Lake Parsippany Property Owners Association logo and title. Member volunteer E. Newman held the role of editor for over 20 years.

August 1975



E. Newman changed the layout of the N&V from a one page news letter to a four page half fold. While basic in design, it gave readers an easy to open, "book style" fold. This fold was just right for a four page newsletter.

Time capsule (Cont.)

The Title font was changed and the LPPOA logo removed. The addition of a calendar was added to highlight events for the month. The extra pages also allowed for local businesses to advertise for a small fee.

"This is our first issue with the expanded format. We hope you like it. The increased ad space makes the News & Views self-supporting and the added columns afford us the opportunity to give you more news." – News & Views Aug. 1975

May 1976



The title font was changed from a bubbly, 1970's font, to a more modern look while keeping the same layout for our readers.

November 1986

Henry Gregory becomes Co-Editor and eventually becomes editor a few months later.

August 2003



The N&V takes a major change to its layout and design. "We have a new Editor and a new Layout/Design person. Pat de la Fuente and Kim Shargay make up our new team. They are very excited about the new challenge

before them. Kim is taking on a family tradition; her uncle, Henry Gregory, was Editor of News & Views for several years in the 1990s." – News & Views Aug 2003

What was happening at lake Parsippany 50 years ago?

- News & Views, September 1971.

FUN-PACKED LABOR DAY WEEKEND PLANNED. "Something for everyone" is the theme of the holiday weekend program this year. The traditional starting event will be the across the lake swim at 9 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 4, starting from Beach #3 (old diving area) and ending at Beach #1. The race will be open to boys and girls through age 17 (other age groups can enter unofficially). Arm patches will be given to all who complete the course. Each entrant must be accompanied by an adult in a boat. Beginning at 11 a.m. on Saturday at Beach #4 there will be bicycle and tricycle events for kids up to 8 years old. On the same day at 1 p.m. on Beach #1, 46 swimming contests will be held ranging from a kiddies kick-board race to a 100-meter husband and wife relay. Boating is the word for Sunday beginning with a junior sailboat race at 1 p.m. and mixed and senior sailing events at 2:30. At 3:30 p.m. Sunday, rowboat contests will be held for girls and women and boys and men. The racecourse will be near the boat house. On Labor Day at 10 a.m. there will be a hole-in-one golf competition at Gobel's Field with events for boys, girls, men and women. A horseshoe pitching competition for men 25 years and older will be held at Beach #1 at 1 p.m. At the same time and place a croquet meet for ladies in the same age group will take place. At 5 p.m. Labor Day, a ping pong tournament will begin for boys and girls at the Clubhouse. Adult competition will begin at 6:30 p.m. To qualify for any of the contests, you must be a member and must register. Registration will be held at Beaches #1, #2, #4 and at the boathouse on the weekends of Aug. 21-22 and Aug. 28-29 from 1 to 3 p.m. A registration fee of 50¢ per person will be charged. This is the maximum fee regardless of how many events you enter. Good luck. Make room for that trophy on your mantel.

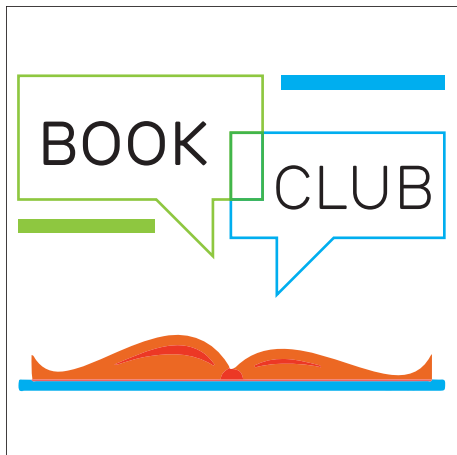

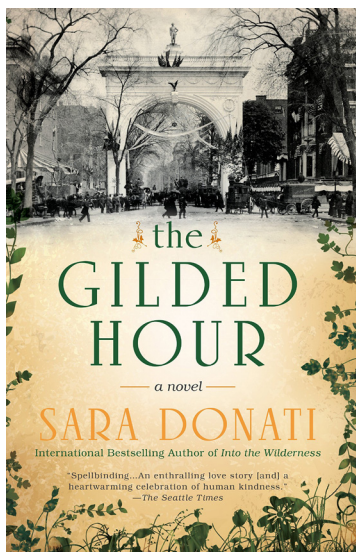

THE GILDED HOUR

FIRST OFF, we don't usually pick a book that is part of a series. So, some of the story lines were not resolved. This was surprising and disappointing for a few of us (\$#@!&*). But still worth the read.

We were wrapped up in the characters and multiple story lines. The book takes place in 1883 New York City and begins with two female doctors, who happened to be related and have the same last name. Women doctors were very unusual at that time. This may not sound interesting at first, but trust us, it is.

Don't be daunted by the heft of this book, 732 pages. Don't let the two-page list of primary characters stop you from starting this book. There is so much to deter you from reading this book and yet you are drawn in and invested almost against your will. The addition of real people (asterisked in the list of primary characters), with snippets of newspaper headlines, mixed with likeable folks, unsavory characters, various cultures, backgrounds, and situations make it fascinating. Some situations believable, some not so believable. It has everything; history, science, religion, romance and mystery.

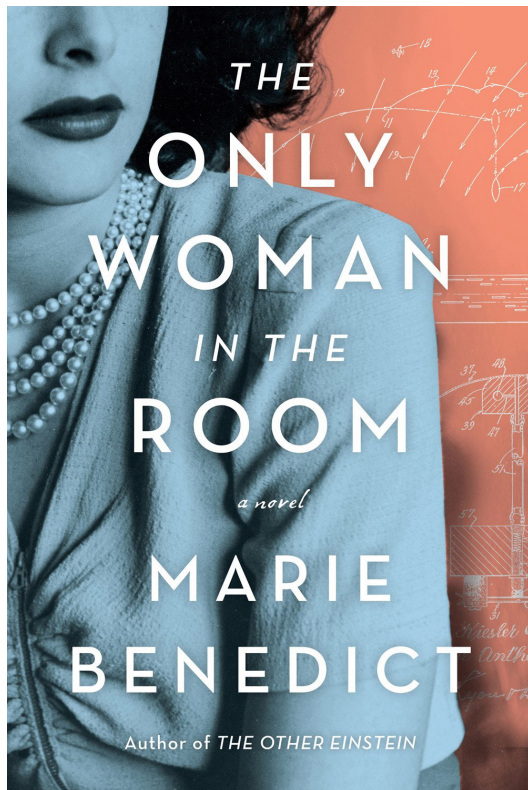
That is New York City. That is good writing. And that makes for great book club conversation!

IN THE ROOM

The novel starts May of 1933 in Vienna, Austria.

Hedwig Keisler is getting a standing ovation for her role in the play *Sissy*. At 19 years old, she is the only daughter of a doting, wealthy, banker father and a concert pianist mother (who is not quite as doting as her father). Based on the year this book begins, you may realize there is a major storm brewing in her part of the world. She ends up being privy to some vital politics and intrigue. Her marriage that same year to a very wealthy and powerful munitions manufacturer puts her

in the thick of things. Known as quite a beauty, she is the perfect example of a trophy wife. No one realizes there are smarts behind that pretty face. She had been privately tutored as a young child and knew 4 languages.

This woman becomes known as Hedy Lamarr and this book only shows the beginning of a long and compelling life. The journey to famous American actress and inventor, yes inventor- is intriguing! Her frequency hopping invention patented in 1942, eventually became part of the foundation for the modern cell phone (per the Authors Note, this was Hedy's take on spread-spectrum technology).

Think of this book as a jump start, easy reader into her life. You may want to follow up with the documentary *Bombshell: The Hedy Lamarr Story* and even check out Wikipedia, because there is a lot to her story that this novel does not cover.

This actress seemed to play many roles in her life and memorize many lines, but I doubt anyone ever really knew the real person behind that beautiful face. Did she ever get a chance to write her own script? would anyone even listen? Was she ahead of her time? How many other women do not get the credit they deserve? Let's keep researching, reading and sharing these lost and little known narratives!

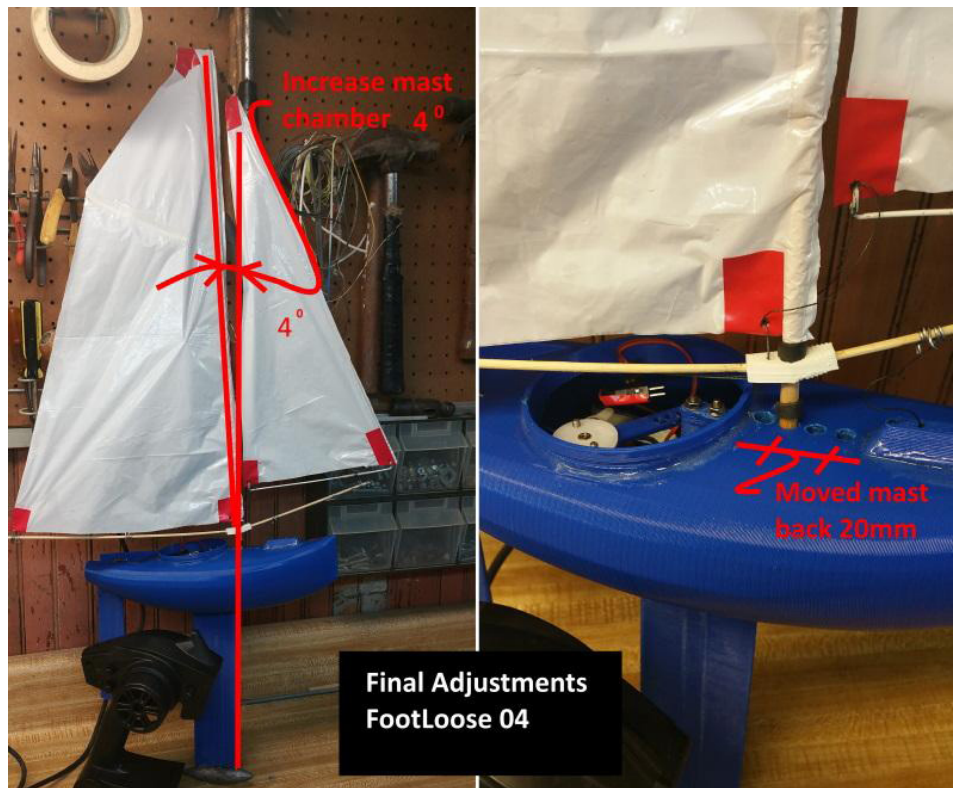
BUILDER'S CORNER

We are about to print our 5th version of the "footy" This is best part of 3d printing. You can

make design improvements and reprint the parts you want to replace.

The first version was stern heavy, so we moved the servos and other heavy internal gear forward. We changed the internal rudder tiller to external. The next version had multiple mast mounting locations. It was used to fine tune the design location of the mast for better helm control during both light and strong wind conditions.


We built two light weight "swing" rigs for testing. Swing rigs are popular for small model yachts because of their simplicity, and ease of construction. We selected "A" and "C" rig sizes for initial testing. "A" rig for light wind days is shown here.

Hope your next cast is one you will never forget,



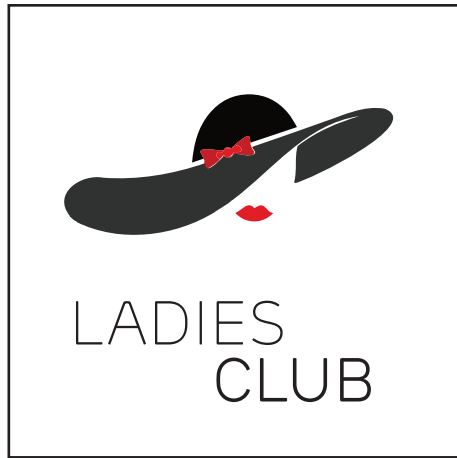

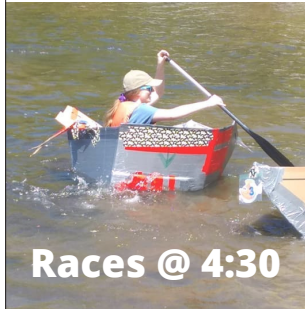
