PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello Neighbors, I hope that you are all well and looking forward to the end of the snow and the beginning of Spring!

Below are a few topics I would like to go over with everyone.

Voting rights

This issue has divided our community for quite a few years now. The evolution of this issue has been, and continues to be, very complex. According to all of our deeds, property owners are responsible for easement maintenance. That means all property owners are obligated to pay to maintain our lake. The LPPOA Board of Directors designed the fee structure as such where property owners can choose not to participate in any recreational activity and could 'opt out' of being a member simply by paying \$115. With this option they must waive their voting rights.

However, we recently received a letter from the DCA (Department of Consumer Affairs) regarding the complaint filed by a group of members against the LPPOA in June, 2020.

DCA's position is that anyone who pays \$115 is

considered a "member in good standing" and LPPOA must recognize their right to not only vote for election of representation, but have the ability to run for positions and serve on the board, if elected. It may seem very clear, however there are still questions about this because an earlier court decision that was handed down seems contrary to this. There are many more details to this very complicated case that can be found on the LPPOA website.

DCA has told us that we need to comply with their order, so we will be taking a vote on this matter at the next board meeting which is scheduled for Monday, March 8th.

Invoices

After the board votes on the latest issue from the DCA, we will be sending out membership fee invoices. This year we are extending the deadline to April 30th. We encourage everyone to sign up and pay online. When you register online, you will provide us with your email address so that we can easily communicate with you about association news as well as up and coming events at the lake.

Collections

The board has started working with collections, so please for those who haven't paid, make arrangements to pay any past due membership fees as well as the current year fees. If you have financial difficulties please contact the resources that have been identified on the invoice. They will arrange an individual payment plan that will work for you.

Volunteering

We are fortunate to have some volunteers who have sacrificed hours and hours of their time to create events for our community, keep the lake clean, stock the lake with fish, deal with legal matters and membership planning. We need your help. Our community cannot be successful without volunteers. It's wonderful to see so many people showing an interest at the meetings, but we need more! We read "The Lost City of Z: A Tale of Deadly Obsession in the Amazon" by David Grann. This is non-fiction, about the adventures of Colonel Percy Harrison Fawcett, "Last of the great Victorian explorers who ventured into uncharted realms with little more than a machete, compass and an almost divine sense of purpose." Page 8.

How come we have heard of people like Amelia Earhart and Ernest Shackleton, but we have NOT heard of Colonel Percy Harrison Fawcett? Why had his fascinating story not made it into our popular shared history? Was it because it was appx.100 years ago? We learned he took a course to become an 'explorer' via the Royal Geographical Society. We read about survival skills, to endure the Amazon jungles unique challenges: weather, plants, animals, poisons, indigenous people, non-indigenous people, lawlessness, aquatic life, and insects, lots of insects!

At some point - as we read about Colonel Fawcetts' adventures and they really were exciting! from supplies falling overboard to poison darts, maggots and even the decision to potentially leave a member of the party behind... to die...

At some point in all this, the theme music of Indiana Jones started playing in the background of my mind. Maybe he HAD somehow in a small way become part of our shared history, but we didn't even realize it!

Fawcett explored the Amazon seven times, providing maps of truly uncharted terrain. He left

his devoted wife and three children for years at a time. It was amazing (or insane) that he kept returning.

May 1925 was the last time a communication was sent out by him. It seems his expedition - made up of himself, his 21-year-old son and his sons' best friend- vanished, just disappeared into the jungle.

Lots to discuss and well written!






BOAT AUCTION

LOOKING FORWARD TO SPRING


