

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We are getting ready for the summer season, and thanks to a few current and past board members, we are working to open the beach for summer 2022. We are at the tail end of the hiring process and ensuring that everything that needs to be done, is. We will provide a complete status regarding the beach at the June board meeting.

We are working out the logistics on the distribution of membership badges and parking tags. An announcement was sent the end of May about boat tag pickup, those are available for pick up now. Membership Badges will be available at the Clubhouse on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays and the times will be announced mid-June.

MEMBERSHIP BADGES

All Premium and New Basic members will receive all new membership badges. Previous members who have chosen to remain Basic can keep your old badges. If you did not pick up your membership badges last year you must do so this year, as we will be creating a security team to enforce LPPOA

rules and regulations addressing unlawful parking and vehicle towing and member validation.

Badges will be provided to all household members of the property- owner/s on the deed. Specifically, this means immediate family members plus their children living with them, 12 months a year.

PARKING TAGS

Most members have parking tags from last year, every member received 2 per property with a 2021 date on them. You will receive 2022 stickers during badge distribution. New members will receive same tags but with the 2022 sticker on them. Basic members from last year, can retain their membership badges but if they want to park on LPPOA property they will need 2022 stickers and should pick them up from the Club House. Once again will be start towing cars from LPPOA properties if you do not have a valid parking tag.

We will provide a complete status regarding the beach at the June board meeting.

PROPERTY MANAGER - JIM MCCANN

Jim will be on-site for the summer between the hours of 8am-4pm every Monday/Wednesday/ Friday. FSR is working with our Tech Team to setup communication distribution (email blast) and a new way to process events. What we have seen so far looks promising. We hope to have this in place by end of June.

ELECTIONS

We are looking for people to be on the Election Committee. Their job is to help conduct our annual election in terms of process, who to contact, mailings, validations, candidate night etc. Please get involved. Reach out to me or Jim McCann our property manager for further information.

SEASON PASS

Premium members will have the option to purchase either daily Guest Pass for \$5 each or a seasonal Guest Pass for \$50, which can be used for additional family, friends not living at the address. Whenever a guest pass is being used, the

property owner must be with the guest, guests cannot go to the beach by themselves. Premium members are the only ones allowed to buy Daily and Season Guest Pass for Non-Resident members and Basic member.

A premium member can buy a guest pass for the following people in these categories.

- Non-Resident Guest
 - is a friend who does not own a property in the OPT visiting you for a day, week, months.
 - is a relative who does not own a property in the OPT visiting you for a day, week, months.
- A Basic member who is a resident and a member in good standing.

The following people cannot buy any type of beach guest pass.

- Basic members who waived their rights to access the beach; they cannot buy any type of guest pass.
- Any resident member who is not in good standing.

June is finally here! It's the beginning of summer and time for us to enjoy, but to also ramp up our safety awareness. June is National Safety Month, and this year is the 25th anniversary of the event that started in 1996.

June was initially established as the National Safety Month in the US because the need for increased awareness of the health and safety risks during summer months for both work and home was recognized. However, I'd like to just talk about summer swimming safety tips.

Keeping everyone safe around the water must be our top priority because of potential threats in and around the lake or any body of water, drowning is the 5th leading cause of unintentional injury death in the US. Ten people die from drowning in the US every day, and of those 10 drownings, two are children aged 14 and younger.


Some safety tips to remember:

- Parents-be actively involved with your child. Keep them in sight at all times.
- For public/lake swimming, swim only in designated areas where there are lifeguards.
- Always swim with a buddy.
- When swimming in our lake, provide close and constant attention to children, even though there are guards present, always watch out for the safety of your own children.
- Never ever leave a young child unattended near water and do not trust a child's life to another child.
- Teach your child to always ask for permission to go near water.
- Do not rely on the use of water wings, swim rings, inflatable toys or other items designated for water recreation to replace adult supervision.
- Enroll in age-appropriate water orientation and learn to swim courses. There are many courses available. Enroll your child!
- Boating safety-remember, EVERYONE wears a life jacket, regardless of swimming ability, on any boat. Here's to a happy, safe, and fun filled summer!



THE WOMEN OF THE COPPER COUNTRY

Did you know that a major copper mine was located in Michigan?

This month we read The Women of the Copper Country: A Novel by Mary Doria Russell. This story takes place in 1913 in Calumet Michigan, in the Upper Peninsula.

'The Copper Country, it's called—written and spoken with capital letters'.

You will never think of copper the same after reading this book. Copper is in cooking pots, coins, buttons, candlesticks, roofs, ships, indoor plumbing, telegraphs and telephones. In war time, it's used in all sorts of ammunition and equipment.

But in 1913 what was the true price of copper?

Early in the book we meet James MacNaughton, the general manager of Calumet and Hecla. Recognized as an early user of scientific industrial management, particularly time and motion studies, he minimizes wasted time and motion to maximize efficiency and productivity. In 1913 Calumet and Hecla is the worlds largest copper mining company.

Calumet and Hecla built itself into a copper mining colossus. From 1868 through 1886, it was the leading copper producer in the United States, and from 1869 through 1876, the leading copper producer in the world.[5] From 1871 through 1880, Calumet and Hecla turned out more than half the copper produced in the United States. In each year save one between 1870 and 1901, Calumet and Hecla made most of the copper produced in the Michigan copper district.

Book Club (Cont.)

As we read, everything starts out sounding goodprofitable mine production, a company town with churches, a theatre, library, hospital, bowling alley, banks and restaurants. Out of all the mines, Calumet and Hecla treat their people pretty well.

But then we also meet Anna Klobuchar Clements, at 6'2" she is known as 'Big Annie'. Representing the women that help support the miners. We begin to see the REAL details of this harsh life.

'Calumet girls become wives. Calumet boys become miners.'

Annie has been making pasties since she was 6 years old. A pasty is a mixture of meat, potatoes, rutabaga, carrots and onions wrapped in a crust made of flour and lard. '.....Cornish turnovers, for pasties are a filling meal that can be eaten out of hand and will stay warm for hours underground if wrapped properly'. The men, some of them

just boys, need all the nourishment they can get. 'Sixteen times each day, six days a week they shovel a ton of broken rock into a car and then push it along iron rails to the elevators. In union mines out west, mules hail the ore trams. In Michigan, immigrants are cheaper than livestock'.

Once we meet Annie, we see the struggle, the stress, the danger, the anticipation - every - single - day - wondering will my husband/father/brother survive the mine today? Annie calculates that by the age of 25 she has been to about 1000 funerals! Afteryet ANOTHER death, Annie and her immigrant neighbors, speaking approximately 33 languages, decide that something has to change. They begin organizing and working together to try to change conditions by striking.

'Women who now refuse to tell another generation of children, This is all you can hope for. This is all your labor is worth. This is all your lives are worth.'

Mother Jones, (yes she is a real person!) a prominent union organizer, community organizer, and activist, made an appearance in Calumet at age 77! She was known for shouting 'Pray for the dead and fight like hell for the living!"

This is a fascinating time of history and generated discussion. This place and time period planted the seeds for future change and the evolution of unions. The author really did her research and gave what felt like an authentic portrayal of what they might have been thinking. Peppered with real facts and quotes from these historical figures we certainly came away enlightened. The book was fiction and a few of us were surprised to find out which characters were real and how much of this tale was very true!

The true price of copper was an extremely high.

Check out the PHHS website to learn how to apply for the \$500 scholarship award we are offering to a deserving senior who is a LPPOA member in good standing.




Scanned poster of the Aquaduck early 1960's

STRAWBERRY JELLO PLAY DOUGH

MATERIALS

- 3 cups plain / all-purpose flour (more flour than usual as the Jello changes the mixture have some extra in case you need more)
- 1 cup salt
- 1 1/2 cups Jello liquid
- 2 tablespoons oil
- 2 tablespoons cream of tartar

PROCESS

If Strawberry is not your thing you can use any other kind of Jello for a variety of colors and smells.






