PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE Pulkit Desai

May is here and spring/summer preparations are on their way. Hiring for the beach continues, necessary equipment is being ordered and water is turned on at all the beaches. Furthermore Earth day cleanup went extremely well. We had a great turnout. New and familiar faces showed up along with many young ones who worked very hard to make our lake look beautiful. The fish stocking event was delightful. We lucked out with the weather. All these things are good signs that we will enjoy Spring and head into hopefully an early Summer.

Recently, John Oliver covered the topic of HOAs on HBO, highlighting how some of them tend to enforce their by-laws and rules excessively. Luckily, we are a common interest community rather than an HOA that is often criticized for imposing excessively strict rules, which is not the case with our community.

However, there are certain violations such as improper parking and missing boat tags that are not strongly enforced. To address this, we plan to establish a Security Committee this year to ensure that only members have access to the community's amenities while also providing non-members with the opportunity to become members.

Membership Badges

All property owners in good standing and Non Property owners members who have paid for their membership will receive all new badges. You will receive 4 badges that can be used by household members that mean immediate family members of the property - owner/s on the deed. Household definition traditionally for LPPOA has been - Immediate family member plus their children living with them. Membership is non-transferrable.

President's Message (Cont.)

PARKING TAGS

All property owners in good standing and Non Property owners members who have paid for their membership will receive 2 parking tags. Once again we will start towing cars from LPPOA properties if you do not have a valid parking tag later this summer.

BOAT TAGS

Those who purchased a boat tag last year will be receiving a new one in the mail for this year. If you require an additional tag or did not obtain a boat tag last year but need one this year, please visit the clubhouse to obtain a tag at no cost. Distribution of boat tags will commence on June 1st, coinciding with the days when our property manager is present at the clubhouse. As previously communicated, any watercraft without a 2023 tag will be removed around mid-June, providing sufficient time for anyone who needs a tag to acquire one. In the event of any inconvenience, kindly contact us.

SEASON PASS

Premium members will have the option to purchase either daily Guest Pass at \$5 each or seasonal Guest Pass for \$50 for additional household members not living with them such as in-laws, grandchildren, cousins and friends. You must be with the guest. They cannot go to the beach by themselves. Premium members are the only ones allowed to buy Daily and Season Guest Pass for Non-Resident members and Basic member.

A premium member can buy a guest pass for the following people in these categories.

- Non-Resident Guest
 - is a friend who does not own a property in the OPT visiting you for a day, week, months.
 - is a relative who does not own a property in the OPT visiting you for a day, week, months.
- A Basic member who is a resident and a member in good standing.

President's Message (Cont.)

The following people cannot buy any type of beach guest pass.

- Basic members who waived their rights to access the beach; they cannot buy any type of guest pass.
- Any resident member who is not in good standing.

TO RECAP – Basic or Premium members this year can only use their badges for people living in their household. We expect an honor system for Basic members and we will be putting in place a process to randomly check people on property and ask if they are Members of the association or not.

TO WRAP UP, I want to emphasize that all board members are volunteers who have families and full-time jobs, and we do not receive any payment for our services. We do this work solely for the betterment of our community. Countless hours are invested in tasks that may go unnoticed. Some changes may take longer to implement, while others are evident immediately. Although we welcome constructive criticism, please bear in mind the commitment and efforts of the board members. Individually, we may achieve little, but collectively we can accomplish so much. We encourage you to volunteer and join us in making a positive impact.

The class for anyone interested in using the club's kayaks throughout the summer will be held on Wednesday, May 24th.


SUMMER SOLSTICE PADDLE, JUNE 21ST




Joan Mahon


